


Desertification Problem in the Sahel and the Horn of Africa

The Sahel and the Horn of Africa regions face mounting development challenges. The major part of the region is desert or dry lands and most of it is estimated to be degraded. The region has also been affected by frequent and severe droughts in recent years. The recent climate change is likely to make desertification even worse.

As people on a low income in the region heavily depend on natural resources, persistent drought has further worsened their livelihood condition. The poverty in the region could further exacerbate insecurity and the increase of refugees and terrorism risk.

Addressing desertification properly and strengthening resilience to climate change are keys to helping nations of the region achieve sustainable development while contributing to peace and stability in the region and globally. 
Against this backdrop, the Government of Kenya, the Government of Senegal, JICA, and the UNCCD with partner African countries and development partners officially announced the launch of the African Initiative for Combating Desertification to Strengthen Resilience to Climate Change in the Sahel and the Horn of Africa (AI-CD) at TICAD VI in Nairobi in August 2016.
